Holly Hanson attended the meeting to give the villages an update on ongoing and new issues:

- Would like to pass on her Thanks for all the reports “For foul smells” from the Bio Waste on Middlegate Lane. The response from the Bio Waste hasn’t been very forthcoming so it will be an ongoing issue
- Carr Lane Issues are still on the Parish council agenda and will be ongoing
- Community “Village Meadow” is in progress, the grass/hedge and verge cutting has commenced, paths have been cleared, clearer access made, and this will be ongoing till spring when village participation will then be required.
- Holly was updated on the blocked drain at 34 Main Street, it is still blocked but there has been a recent visit from “a man with a clipboard” so it is on the councils radar and hopefully there will be further progress, Holly will chase with North Lincolnshire Council
- Playing Field and Dog mess issue has been raised and is on the Parish council agenda to be discussed at the next meeting, Holly will update on progress

4: Claire Welford – Engagement Officer

Claire Welford attended the meeting to discuss the PCC (Police and Crime Commissioner).

Claire is North Lincolnshire’s Engagement officer.

They represent the public and give the public a voice, they listen to community views and help to set up strategic priorities for the force based on community needs

The PCC is the direct link to the Chief Constable

They are responsible for Victim Support, Drug and alcohol programmes, sexual assault, domestic abuse and restorative justice

She advised several services that were available and an update on services already available

- Calls to 101 will be changed from 15p per minute to no charge
- Cut down on call waiting times

- Community Speed Watch has launched
- Crimes can be reported online
- A lengthy discussion was had on the 101 service within the meeting

5: Tracey Coyne – Safer Neighbourhood Office

Tracey Coyne attended the meeting with up to date crime figures for Brigg & Wolds Ward for September 2018 – August 2019

She gave a brief run through of the figures and how the Safer Neighbourhood use to the figures to address issues or increase support at certain times of the year such at Bonfire Night.
